THE CHILDREN'S BIBLE (MARK 10:13-15)

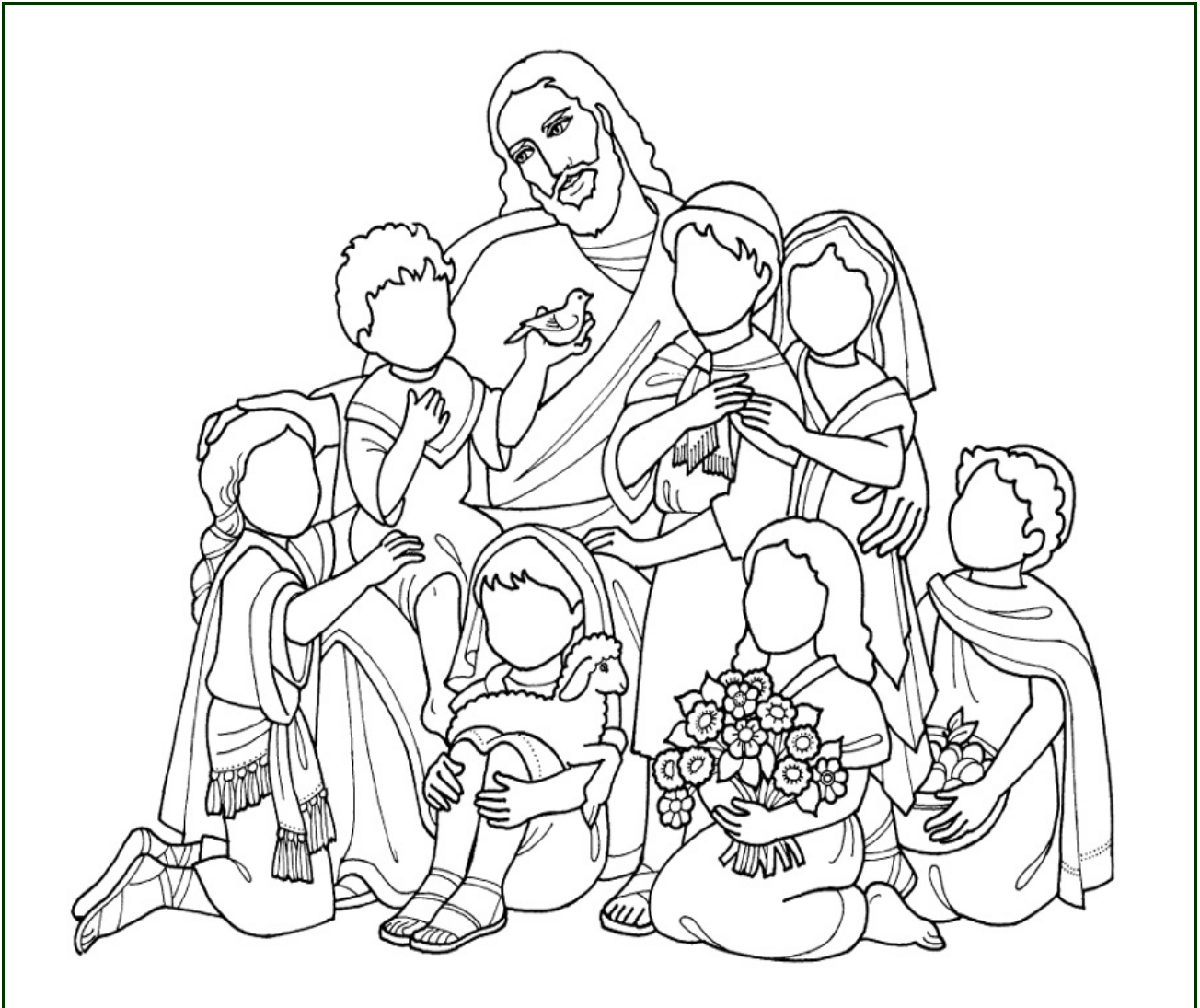
